MILTON MILL, WHINS OF MILTON

NOTICE is hereby given that proposals for amendment to the above Development Plan (hereinafter referred to as "the proposals") were submitted to the Secretary of State for Scotland on Friday, 29th day of November 1974.

The proposals relate to the allocation of land at Milton Mill, Whins of Milton, for residential development and public open space and rezoning a small area presently allocated for public open space to residential zoning.

Any person making such an objection or representation may, by sending to the County Clerk, County Offices, Viewforth, Stirling, a request in writing specifying therein an address for service, require the County Clerk to serve him with a notice of the eventual amendment to the Development Plan.

BURGH OF ALLOA

ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1967

THE BURGH OF ALLOA (ALLOA WEST LEVEL
CROSSING) (BOX JUNCTION) ORDER 1974

1. THE Town Council of the Burgh of Alloa propose to make an Order under Section 1(1), (2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968 providing for boxed areas in Grange Road at Alloa West Level Crossing.

2. The effect of the Order will be to prohibit the driving of a vehicle into a boxed area and thereafter in such a direction that it becomes necessary, owing to the presence of stationary vehicles, for any part of the vehicle to remain at rest within the area.

3. Full details of these proposals are in the draft Order which, together with a plan showing the boxed areas and a statement of the Council's reasons for proposing to make the Order, may be examined at the Town Clerk's Department, Municipal Buildings, Alloa between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. Mondays to Fridays.

THE CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF DUNDEE
THE CITY OF DUNDEE (WEST BELL STREET
MULTI-STOREY CAR PARK) ORDER 1975,
(AMENDED NOTICE)

1. NOTICE is hereby given that the Corporation of the City of Dundee proposed to make an Order under Section 31(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968.

2. The purpose of the proposed Order is to regulate and control the use of the car park building erected upon ground lying on the north side of West Bell Street in the City of Dundee and known as "the West Bell Street Multi-Storey Car Park".

3. When this Order comes into effect any vehicle which complies with the description set out in the Schedule appended hereto may be left in the said Car Park at any time on payment at entry of a charge of 10p (Sundays free); but subject to alteration of such operating times and charges by the Corporation at any time without prior intimation to the public.

4. Exceptions will permit waiting in the Car Park without charge:—

- for Police, Fire Brigade, Ambulance and certain local authority purposes;
- for purposes of the supply of gas, electricity, water or telephone services;
- by Disabled Person's Vehicles which comply with the description set out in the Schedule appended hereto, provided that such vehicles are at all times left wholly within a marked stall.
