Notes

- 1. The following diseases were eradicated from Great Britain in the years indicated: cattle plague or rinderpest (pestis bovina), 1877; epizootic lymphangitis (lymphangitis epizootica), 1906; foot-and-mouth disease (aphtae epizooticae), 1968; fowl plague (pestis avium), 1963; glanders (including farcy) (malleus), 1928; parasitic mange (psoroptes et sarcoptes scabiei equi), 1948; pleuropneumonia (pleuropneumonia contagiosa bovum), 1898; rabies (lyssa), 1970 and sheep pox (variola ovina), 1866.
- 2. The following diseases have never been recorded in Great Britain: African horse sickness (pestis equorum), African swine fever (pestis suum africana), blue tongue (febris catarrhalis ovium), dourine (exanthema coitale paralyticum), equine encephalomyelitis (meningo-encephalomyelitis enzootica eq.), equine infectious anaemia (anaemia infectiosa equorum), lumpy skin disease (dermatosis nodularis) and Teschen disease (encephalomyelitis enzootica suum).

THE TRUNK ROADS (ELLON) (PROHIBITION OF WAITING AND LOADING) ORDER 1974

THE Secretary of State proposes to make an order imposing waiting, and loading and unloading restrictions on a length of the trunk road (Route A.92) at Ellon, Aberdeenshire from a point 60 yards south of the junction with Bridge Street to a point 15 yards east of the south east junction with the Square. The Order will provide exceptions to enable a vehicle to wait for as long as may be necessary for a person to board or alight or to be used in connection with maintenance operations and other works.

THE GLASGOW MONKLAND MOTORWAY (STAGE II) (CONNECTING ROADS) SPECIAL ROADS SCHEME 1973

THE Secretary of State gives notice that he has confirmed under Section 1 of the Special Roads Act 1949, as read with the Transfer of Functions (Roads, Bridges and Ferries) Order 1955, the Glasgow Monkland Motorway (Stage II) (Connecting Roads) Special Roads Scheme 1973, which was made by the Corporation of the City of Glasgow under Sections 1 and 2 of the said Act, the effect of which is to authorise the Corporation to provide special roads (motorways) in the City of Glasgow on the routes prescribed by the Scheme, for the exclusive use of traffic of Classes 1 and 2 set out in the Schedule to the said Act, as varied by the Special Roads (Classes of Traffic) (Scotland) Order 1971 to connect existing roads to be provided and improved under the Glasgow Monkland (Stage II) Special Roads (Side Roads) Order 1973, with the Glasgow Monkland Motorway (Stage II) Special Road. The Scheme as confirmed shall become operative in accordance with paragraph 16 of Schedule 1 to the said Act on the date on which this notice is first published. Copies of the Scheme (as confirmed) and of the relevant plan may be inspected, free of charge, at the offices of the Scottish Development Department, 43 Jeffrey Street, Edinburgh, or at the Town Clerk's Office, City Chambers, Glasgow, at all reason-Copies of the instrument of Confirmation of the Scheme which contains the copy of the Scheme as confirmed can be able hours. purchased through any bookseller or direct from Her Majesty's Stationery Office, 13a Castle Street, Edinburgh.
