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FROM FRIDAY, APRIL 24, TO TUESDAY, APRIL 28, 1812.

The London Gazette Extraordinary of Friday, April 24, contains a dispatch from General the Earl of Wellington, announcing the surrender of Badajoz, on the 6th of April 1812, with the French governor, General Philipon, his staff, and the whole garrison, to the allied army under the command of his Lordship.

WESTMINSTER—APRIL 20, 1812.

This day the Lords being met, a message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by the Yeoman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that *The Lords, authorized by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by the Prince Regent, in the name and on the behalf of his Majesty, for declaring his Majesty's Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers, to bear the Commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to*

An act for settling and securing a certain annuity on Earl Wellington, and the two next persons to whom the title of Earl Wellington shall descend, in consideration of his eminent services.

An act for granting additional duties on mahogany not imported from the Bay of Honduras, and for reducing the duties on certain species of wood imported from the said Bay.

An act for amending the laws relating to the local militia in England.

An act to prohibit all intercourse between the island of Jamaica and certain parts of the island of Saint Domingo.

An act to make provision for a limited time respecting certain grants of offices.

An act for the relief of infant suitors in courts of equity, entitled to stock or annuities in any of the public or other funds, transferable at the Bank of England.

An act to amend and continue until the 25th day of March 1813, an act of the 45th year of his present Majesty, for appointing Commissioners to inquire into the public expenditure, and the conduct of the public business in the military departments therein mentioned; and another act of the 51st year of his present Majesty, for

continuing and extending the same to public works, executed by the office of works and others.

An act for altering and amending an act made in the 32d year of the reign of his late Majesty King George the Second, for the relief of debtors with respect to the imprisonment of their persons; and of an act made in the 39th year of his present Majesty, for making perpetual an act made in the 33d year of his present Majesty, for the further relief of debtors, and for other purposes in the said act expressed.

An act to repeal an act made in the 39th year of the reign of Queen Elizabeth, intitled "An act against lewd and wandering persons pretending themselves to be soldiers or mariners."

An act for the more effectual regulation of pilots, and of the pilotage of ships and vessels on the coast of England.

An act for amending the laws relating to the allowance of the bounties on pilchards exported, until the 24th day of June 1819.

An act to continue until the expiration of six months after the conclusion of the present war, an act made in the 46th year of his present Majesty, for permitting the importation of masts, yards, bowsprits, and timber for naval purposes, from the British colonies in North America, duty free.

An act for increasing the rates of subsistence to be paid to innkeepers and others, on quartering soldiers.

An act to provide for regulating the warehousing of spirits distilled from corn in Ireland for exportation, without payment of the duty of excise chargeable thereon, and to transfer the custody of spirits so warehoused from the Commissioners of customs and port-duties in Ireland, and their officers, to the Commissioners of inland excise and taxes in Ireland, and their officers.

An act to amend the laws relating to the militia of Ireland.

An act to amend an act of the last session of Parliament, making provision for the families of militiamen in Ireland.

An act for enabling the wives and families of soldiers, embarked in Ireland for foreign service, to return to their homes.

An act for erecting a new gaol in or near the burgh of Cupar, in the county of Fife, and for other purposes relating thereto.

An act to enable the company of proprietors of the Cranston-Hill water-works, to raise more money for the further supply of the city and suburbs of Glasgow, and places adjacent, with water.

An act for making further provision for the clerks in the office of the Accountant-General of the Court of Chancery, after a certain length of service.

An act for enlarging the term and powers of several acts for making and repairing certain roads in the coun-

ty of Renfrew, building a bridge or bridges at Inchinnan, and regulating the statute-labour of the said county; and for other purposes relative thereto.

And to several English, &c. acts, and fourteen private acts.
