

## THE OPENCAST COAL ACT 1958

NOTICE is hereby given that the National Coal Board intend to submit an application entitled the Threeprig (010770) Application to the Secretary of State for Energy for an Authorisation under Section 1 of the above-mentioned Act to work coal or cause or permit coal to be worked by opencast operations. The land which the National Coal Board require to occupy in this connection is described in the schedule hereto.

A copy of the application and of the map referred to therein can be inspected at the office of the National Coal Board, Opencast Executive, Whaupknowe Opencast Coal Site, Climpy Road, Forth, Lanarkshire, between 1000 hours and 1600 hours Monday to Friday inclusive.

## SCHEDULE

The land is situated within the Parish of Shotts in the Seventh District in the County of Lanark. It lies  $1\frac{1}{2}$  miles north west of Shotts and 1 mile south east of Salsburgh; west of the unclassified road from Kirk O'Shotts to Shotts, east of the unclassified road from Kirk O'Shotts to Jersey and astride the unclassified road from Jersey to Fortissat.

The area of the land is approximately 457 acres.

## ARGENTINA: OFFICIAL CERTIFICATE

THE Secretary of State for Scotland in exercise of the powers conferred on him by the Imported Food (Scotland) Regulations 1968, as amended by the Imported Food (Scotland) Amendment Regulations 1973, hereby restricts recognition of the Official Certificate reproduced in the First Schedule to the Notice published in the *Edinburgh Gazette* dated 23rd August 1974 for the importation of meat and meat products from Argentina, to the extent shown in the Schedule hereto.

The Notice published in the *Edinburgh Gazette* dated 22nd October 1974 is hereby revoked.
