His Royal Highness the Prince Regent, in the name and on the behalf of his Majesty, Sovereign of the Most Noble Order of the Garter, has been pleased, by letters patent under the sign-manual of his Royal Highness and the great seal of the Order, to dispense with all the statutes and regulations usually observed in regard to Installation; and to give and grant unto his Grace Henry Pelham, Duke of Newcastle, Knight Elect of the said Most Noble Order, full power and authority to exercise all rights and privileges belonging to a Knight Companion of the Most Noble Order of the Garter, as if he had been formally installed; any decree, rule, or usage to the contrary notwithstanding.
