

TRUNK ROADS ACT 1946
SPECIAL ROADS ACT 1949
ROADS (SCOTLAND) ACT 1970
DALMAGARRY TO BOGBAIN

THE Secretary of State hereby gives notice that he has made the following Orders in connection with a diversion of the London-Edinburgh-Thurso Trunk Road A.9 between Dalmagarry and Bogbain in the District of Inverness.

- (a) An Order under Section 1(2) and 2(3) of the Trunk Roads Act 1946 to provide for the construction of two new lengths of road and for the Highland Regional Council to become the highway authority for the lengths of old road which will cease to be trunk road.
- (b) An Order under Section 14(1) of the Special Roads Act 1949 to provide for the construction of new roads, improvement of existing roads and stopping up of existing roads to form new and improved connections with the new trunk road.
- (c) An Order under Section 14(1) of the Roads (Scotland) Act 1970 to provide for the stopping up of private means of access to premises from the new trunk road.

Copies of the Order referred to at (a) above, the title of which is The London-Edinburgh-Thurso Trunk Road (Dalmagarry to Bogbain) Order 1976 can be purchased through any bookseller or direct from Her Majesty's Stationary Office, 13a Castle Street, Edinburgh, EH2 3AR.

A copy of each Order and of the plans referred to therein have been deposited at the offices of the Scottish Development Department, New St. Andrew's House, St. James Centre, Edinburgh EH1 3SX; and the Regional Council for the Highland Region, County Buildings, Ardrross Street, Inverness and may be inspected at all reasonable hours.

Any person aggrieved by the Orders and desiring to question their validity or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Trunk Road Act 1946, Special Roads Act 1949 and Roads (Scotland) Act 1970 or on the grounds that any requirements of the said Acts

of 1946, 1949 or 1970 or any regulation made under those Acts have not been complied with in relation to the Orders may within six weeks from 30th April 1976 apply to the Court of Session for the suspension or quashing of the Orders or of any provision contained therein.
