THE TRUNK ROADS (RESTRICTED ROADS) (NAIRN) ORDER 1976

THE Secretary of State gives notice that he has made the above order extending the 30 m.p.h. speed limit on the Aberdeen-Inverness Trunk Road (Route A.96) at Nairn from a point 495 yards south west of the centre line of the junction with Manse Road south westwards to a point 70 yards east of the centre line of the junction with Moss-side Road, a distance of 302 yards.

THE TRUNK ROADS (GIRVAN) (PROHIBITION OF WAITING) ORDER 1976

THE Secretary of State gives notice that he proposes to make an order imposing waiting restrictions on the trunk road (Route A.77) at Girvan on both sides of Bridge Street from the north kerbline of Hamilton Street northwards for a distance of 59 yards and on both sides of Dalrymple Street from the south kerbline of Knockcushan Street southwards for a distance of 54 yards. The order will provide exemptions to enable a vehicle to wait to enable a person to board or alight, to enable goods to be loaded or unloaded and for maintenance operations and other works.

Disabled persons will also be exempted. The Trunk Roads (Dalrymple Street and Bridge Street, Girvan) (Restriction of Waiting) Order 1976 will be revoked in so far as it relates to the above lengths of road.

Full details of the proposals are contained in the draft order, which together with a copy of the order to be revoked, a plan showing the lengths of road involved and a statement of the Secretary of State's reasons for proposing to make the order, may be examined during normal office hours at:—

NOTICE is hereby given that on 20th August 1976, the Secretary of State for Scotland in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by Article 4(2) of the Town and Country Planning (General Development) (Scotland) Order 1975 approved the District of Clackmannan (Restriction of Permitted Development) (Dollar Conservation Area) Direction 1976.

The Direction requires planning permission to be applied for in respect of development within the curtilage of a dwelling-house; sundry minor operations; repairs to private streets and private way; development by local authorities; development by Water or Hydraulic Power Undertakings, Gas Undertakings, Electricity Undertakings or the Post Office (but excepting from said undertakings any development constructed below ground); and development by planning authorities where any of these developments are situated within the Dollar Conservation Area.
