THE GRAMPIAN REGIONAL COUNCIL  
(UNNAMED LANE BETWEEN HOLBURN STREET  
AND RIVERSIDE DRIVE, ABERDEEN)  
(PROHIBITION OF DRIVING) ORDER 1977

The Grampian Regional Council propose to make an Order under Section 1(1), (2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, and Section 133 of the Local Government (Scotland) Act 1973.

When this Order comes into effect no person shall drive or cause or permit to be driven any vehicle on the following lengths of road:—

(a) That section of the unnamed lane between Holburn Street and Riverside Drive extending in a south westerly direction from its junction with Holburn Street for a distance of 48 metres.

(b) That section of the said unnamed lane extending in a north easterly direction from its junction with Riverside Drive for a distance of 51 metres.

Exceptions will permit the driving of vehicles which are being used:—

(a) for the conveyance of persons, goods or merchandise to or from any premises situated on or adjacent to the lengths of road;

(b) in connection with any building operation or demolition in or adjacent to the lengths of road, the removal of any obstruction to traffic in the lengths of road, the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the lengths of road or the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or adjacent to the lengths of road of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telegraphic line as defined in the Telegraphic Act 1878.

Bollards will be erected at a point halfway along the said lengths of road to prevent the passage of through traffic.

Full details of these proposals are in the draft Order which, together with a map showing the affected lengths of road and a Statement of the Council's reasons for proposing to make the Order may be examined at the office of the Director of Roads, Woodhill House, Ashgrove Road West, Aberdeen, and at the office of the Divisional Road Surveyor, St. Nicholas House, Broad Street, Aberdeen, between the hours of 9.00 a.m. and 12 noon and 2.00 p.m. and 5.00 p.m.

Any person wishing to object to the proposed Order should send details of the grounds for objection in writing to the undersigned by Monday, 22nd August 1977.
