## WAR-OFFICE—OCTOBER 27, 1812.

In consequence of the distinguished gallantry displayed by the 2d battalion of the 87th regiment, in successfully defending the breach at Tariffa, in Spain, on the 31st December 1811, against a superior force of the enemy, his Royal Highness, the Prince Regent, in the name and on the behalf of his Majesty, has been pleased to approve of the word "*Tariffa*" being borne upon the colours and appointments of the 87th regiment, in addition to any other badges or devices which may have heretofore been granted to that regiment.
