(40 m.p.h. SPEED LIMITS) (No. 1) ORDER 1977

NOTICE is hereby given that The Fife Regional Council in exercise of their powers under Sections 74(1) and 84D(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, and Schedule 14 of the Local Government (Scotland) Act 1973, and with the consent of the Secretary of State for Scotland, on 22nd December 1977 made the above Order.

The effect of the Order is to incorporate short extensions to and in some cases to effect revocations from existing 40 m.p.h. Speed Limits imposed on the following routes:—

1. Route A.916 at Bonnybank
2. Route A.907 at Halbeath
3. Route B.996 at Kelty
4. A.909 at Kelty.

The Order will come into operation on the 30th day of December 1977 and on that date the lengths of road specified in the Schedule to the Order shall become subject to a Speed Limit of 40 m.p.h. and the following orders shall cease to have effect to the extent indicated below:—

The County Council of the County of Fife (40 m.p.h. Speed Limit Direction) (No. 1) Order 1962 so far as relating to Route A.916 at Bonnybank and Route A.907 at Halbeath as described in the Schedule thereto.

The Trunk Roads (40 m.p.h. Speed Limit Direction) (Scotland) (No. 1) Order 1961 so far as relating to Routes B.996 and A.909 (formerly Route A.90) as described in the Schedule thereto.
