THE Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that they have made an Order under Section 41(2) of the Finance Act 1969, viz.: The Capital Gains Tax (Exempt Gilt-edged Securities) (No. 1) Order 1978.

This Order adds the following Gilt-edged Securities to the category of stocks and bonds which are exempt from tax on capital gains if held for more than 12 months:—

- 12% Treasury Stock 1995
- 8½% Treasury Stock 1982
- 3% Exchequer Stock 1981
- 10½% Exchequer Stock 1997
- 10% Treasury Stock 1992
- 8½% Exchequer Stock 1981

The Order, dated 30th January 1978, has been published as Statutory Instrument 1978 No. 141. Copies may be purchased (price 10p net) direct from Her Majesty's Stationery Office or from any bookseller.

THE Boot and Shoe Repairing Wages Council (Great Britain) hereby give notice of proposals for (1) varying the statutory minimum remuneration set out in the Wages (Boot and Shoe Repairing) Order 1977 (Order D(170)); (2) amending the provisions relating to holidays and holiday remuneration set out in the Wages (Boot and Shoe Repairing) (Holidays) Order 1977 (Order D(171)); and (3) the revocation of Order D(170).

The Wages Council intends that the revised provisions shall come into operation as from 12th February 1978.

Particulars of the proposals are contained in the Wages Council's Notices D(172) and D(173), copies of which may be obtained on application to the Secretary of the Wages Council at the address given below. The Wages Council will consider any written representation with respect to the proposals if made within 14 days from 14th February 1978. Any such representation should bear the writer's address and signature and be sent to the Secretary, Boot and Shoe Repairing Wages Council (Great Britain), 12 St. James's Square, London SW1Y 4LL. It is desirable that persons making objections should state the precise nature of their objections and quote the number of the Wages Council's Notices of Proposals D(172) and D(173).
