TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS

1. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Accountant's Office (Bank Buildings) at the Bank of England on Friday, the 24th February 1978 at 1.00 p.m., for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act 1877, and the National Loans Act 1968, to the amount of £300,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000, £100,000, £250,000 or £1,000,000. They will be dated at the option of the tenderer on any business day from Monday 27th February 1978 to Friday, the 3rd March 1978 inclusive and will be due 91 days after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000 and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated and the net amount per cent. (being a multiple of one new halfpenny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. Notification will be sent on the same day as Tenders are received to the persons whose Tenders are accepted in whole or in part. Payment in full of the amounts due in respect of such accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of cash or by draft or cheque drawn on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

EDUCATION (SCOTLAND) ACTS 1962 AND 1969

- (b) any person holding any office, place or employment, or receiving any pension, compensation allowance, bursary or emolument, under or arising out of the endowment to which the scheme relates, on the ground that the scheme does not comply with the provisions of Part VI and IV of the Acts of 1962 and 1969 respectively as to savings or making due compensation for his vested interests,

the Secretary of State proposes by statutory instrument to make the scheme in the terms in which it has been published.

If within one month from the date hereof a petition praying that the scheme be laid before Parliament is presented to the Secretary of State, New St. Andrew's House, Edinburgh

EH1 3SY, in accordance with the provisions of subsection (6) of Section 125 of the said Act as amended by paragraph 11 of Schedule 11 of the Local Government (Scotland) Act 1973 by the governing body of the endowment to which the scheme relates; the council of any district or any education authority directly affected by the scheme; any ratepayers (not being less than 20) of any district or place directly affected by the scheme or any person having a vested interest in the said Morrison's Academy Trust or any part of it, the Secretary of State shall lay the statutory instrument containing the scheme before Parliament, and that statutory instrument shall be subject to annulment in pursuance of a resolution of either House thereof.
