1. SCHEDULE

Land Comprised in the Authorisation

The land, which extends to about 517 acres (209 hectares), is situated mainly within Dunfermline District in Fife Region but also includes about 2½ acres (1 hectare) within Clackmannan District in Central Region. It lies about 2½ miles west of Saline and about 1½ miles east of Forest Mill and is in two parts separated by the Forest Mill - Saline Road (C.36). The larger part, of about 470 acres (190 hectares), is bounded on the north-east by the Dollar - Saline road (B.913) and part of the Black Devon River, on the north by a ridge of high ground called Thorny Hill, on the north-west by a further part of the Black Devon River, on the south-west by the Regional boundary and on the south by the Forest Mill - Saline road. The smaller part, of about 47 acres (19 hectares), is bounded on the north by the Forest Mill - Saline Road, on the south-west by an area of woodland and the Regional boundary and on the east by a further area of woodland.
