TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS

1. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

6. Notification will be sent on the same day as Tenders are received to the persons whose Tenders are accepted in whole or in part. Payment in full of the amounts due in respect of such accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England

by means of cash or by draft or cheque drawn on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. on the day on which the relative bills are to be dated.

7. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Bank of England.

8. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.
