(SERVICE ROAD, TALBOT STREET, GRANGEMOUTH) (PROHIBITION OF WAITING) ORDER 1980

THE Central Regional Council propose to make an Order under Sections 1(1), (2), (3) and (3C) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968 which, in effect, will prohibit vehicles waiting on the section of road described in the Schedule hereto.

Exceptions will permit vehicles waiting for:-

- (a) picking up and setting down passengers;
- (b) leading and unloading goods;
- (c) purposes connected with road maintenance, gas, electricity, and water supplies, post office telephone service, police, ambulance service.

Disabled drivers, doctors and nurses will be exempt.

Full details of these proposals are in the draft Order which, together with a map showing the restrictions and a statement of the Council's reasons for promoting the Order, may be examined at (i) Room 13, Regional Council Offices (Administration and Legal Services Department), Viewforth, Stirling; and (ii) Falkirk District Council (Environmental Health Department), Municipal Buildings, Falkirk, for three weeks from 24th October 1980.

MINARD ROAD/POLLOKSHAWS ROAD, GLASGOW (PROHIBITION OF RIGHT-HAND TURNS) ORDER 1980

ON 10th October 1980 the Regional Council made the above named Order under Section 1(1), (2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968 and Section 133 of and Schedule 14 to the Local Government (Scotland) Act 1973.

This Order, which comes into operation on 27th October 1980 prohibits right turn movements from, Minard Road into Pollokshaws Road, Glasgow and from Pollokshaws Road into Minard Road.
