CERTIFICATES OF TAX DEPOSIT

(Series 5)

ON and after Monday, 9th February 1981 the rates of interest applicable to deposits accepted under the Prospectus (Series 5) dated 31st July 1980 and applied in payment of a scheduled liability will be 12½%. The rate of interest on deposits withdrawn for cash will be 10%. An interest supplement, which is only payable in respect of a deposit applied in payment of a scheduled liability, of 1½% will be paid in respect of the first 2 months of a deposit. A nil rate of interest will apply to deposits held for more than 6 months and applied in payment of a scheduled liability. These rates remain in force until further notice.

On and after Monday, 9th February 1981 these rates also apply until further notice to deposits made under the earlier Prospectuses (Series 1, 2, 3 and 4) which reach the second or fourth anniversary of the deposits, as applicable, in accordance with the terms and conditions set out therein.

WAGES COUNCILS ACT 1979

LAUNDRY WAGES COUNCIL (GREAT BRITAIN)

THE Laundry Wages Council (Great Britain) hereby gives notice of proposals for (1) varying the statutory minimum remuneration as set out in the Wages (Laundry) Order 1980 (Order W(137)) and the Wages (Laundry) (Amendment) Order 1980 (Order W(139)); and (2) the revocation of Orders W(137) and W(139).

The Wages Council intends that the revised provisions shall come into operation on 20th February 1981.

Particulars of the proposals are contained in the Wages Council's Notice W(140), copies of which may be obtained on application to the Secretary of the Wages Council at the address given below. The Wages Council will consider any written representation with respect to the proposals if made within 14 days from 10th February 1981. Any such representation should bear the writer's address and signature and be sent to the Secretary, Laundry Wages Council (Great Britain), 12 St. James's Square, London SW1Y 4LL. It is desirable that persons making objections should state the precise nature of their objections and quote the number of the Wages Council's Notice of Proposals W(140).

CONVERSION OF PART OF HIGHWAY TO FOOTPATH IN THURSO

THE Secretary of State for Scotland, in accordance with Section 204(1) and (2) of the Town and Country Planning (Scotland) Act 1972, hereby gives notice that he proposes to make an Order under Sections 198(3) and 201 of that Act authorising the conversion of part of High Street, Thurso to a footpath. The title of the Order is The Conversion of Highway (High Street (in part) Thurso) Order 1981.
