PETROLEUM AND SUBMARINE PIPE-LINES ACT 1975

NOTICE OF THE ISSUE OF SUBMARINE PIPELINE WORKS AUTHORISATIONS

THE Secretary of State for Energy hereby gives notice that submarine pipeline works authorisations have been issued to AMOCO (UK) EXPLORATION COMPANY, whose registered office is at St. Alban's House, Haymarket, London SW1Y 4QX, for construction and use of a 20 inch crude oil pipeline that extends between the NW Hutton Platform at latitude 61°06'24" North and longitude 01° 18'33" East and the Cormorant 'A' Platform at latitude 61°06' 10" North and longitude 01° 04' 22" East and a 10 inch gas pipeline that extends between the NW Hutton Platform and the Western Leg Gas Gathering Pipeline at latitude 61°00' 01" North and longitude 01° 23' 59" East.

Except with the consent of the Secretary of State, the 20 inch pipeline may only be used to convey crude oil and its associated hydrocarbons and the 10 inch pipeline may only be used to convey natural gas. The pipelines may be used by the holder and certain other bodies specified in the authorisations and, with the holder's agreement and with the consent of the Secretary of State, by others persons. Amoco (UK) Exploration Company has been appointed operator of the pipelines.

TRUNK ROADS ACT 1946 ROADS SCOTLAND ACT 1970 THE LONDON-EDINBURGH-THURSO TRUNK ROAD

(SCRABSTER EXTENSION TRUNKING) ORDER 1981

THE Secretary of State gives notice that he has made an Order providing for the trunking of the unclassified road at Scrabster leading to the eastern pier of the harbour outer basin which will become part of the London-Edinburgh-Thurso Trunk Road (A882).

THE TRUNK ROADS (ROUTE A98) (MACDUFF) (PROHIBITION OF WAITING AND LOADING) ORDER 1981

THE Secretary of State gives notice that he has made the above Order which revokes The Trunk Roads (Macduff) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1972 and The Trunk Roads (Macduff) (Prohibition of Waiting and Loading) Order 1974 and imposes new and amended waiting and loading restrictions on the Trunk Road (Route A98) in Macduff as follows:

(a) No waiting/Loading at any time.

The south-east side of that length of the Perth-Dundee-Aberdeen-Inverness Trunk Road (Route A98) in the Grampian Region at Macduff, known as Shore Street, from a point 13.7 metres south of the south kerbline of Duff Street northwards to a point 13.7 metres north of the north kerbline of Duff Street.

(b) No waiting at any time.

The following lengths of the Perth-Dundee-Aberdeen-Inverness Trunk Road (Route A98) in the Grampian Region at Macduff known as Crook O'Ness Street, thereafter Skene Street and thereafter Buchan Street:

- (a) On the west side of the road from a point opposite the north kerbline of Nicol's Brae northwards, then eastwards to the west kerbline of Gellymill Street.
- (b) On the north side of the road from the east kerbline of Gellymill Street eastwards to a point 15 metres east of the east kerbline of Manner Street.
- (c) On the east side of the road from the north kerbline of Nicol's Brae northwards, then eastwards to the west kerbline of Gellymill Street.
- (d) On the south side of the road from the east kerbline of Gellymill Street eastwards to a point 15 metres east of the east kerbline of Market Street.
- (e) On the south side of the road from a point 15 metres west of the west kerbline of Clergy Street eastwards to a point 15 metres east of the east kerbline of Clergy Street.
- (f) On the south side of the road from the west kerbline of High Street westwards for a distance of 15 metres.
- (g) On the south side of the road from the north kerbline of Skene Street eastwards for a distance of 15 metres.

THE POST OFFICE OVERSEAS LETTER POST AMENDMENT (NO. 8) SCHEME 1981

The Post office, by virtue of the powers conferred upon it by Section 28 of the Post Office Act 1969, and of all other powers enabling it in this behalf, hereby makes the following Scheme:

Commencement and citation

- 1.--(1) This Scheme shall come into operation on the 1st July 1981 and may be cited as the Post Office Overseas Letter Post Amendment (No. 8) Scheme 1981.
 - (2) This Scheme shall be read as one with the Post Office Overseas Letter Post Scheme 1977 (Post Office Scheme P5/1977) (hereinafter called "the Scheme") as amended by the Post Office Overseas Letter Post Amendment (No. 1) Scheme 1979 (Post Office Scheme P2/1979), the Post Office Overseas Letter Post Amendment (No. 2) Scheme 1979 (Post Office Scheme P7/1979), the Post Office Overseas Letter Post Amendment (No. 3) Scheme 1979 (Post Office Scheme P8/1979), the Post Office Overseas Letter Post Amendment (No. 4) Scheme 1980 (Post Office Scheme P2/1980), the Post Office Overseas Letter Post Amendment (No. 5) Scheme 1980 (Post Office Scheme P7/1980), the Post Office Overseas Letter Post Amendment (No. 6) Scheme 1981 (Post Office Scheme P2/1981) and the Post Office Overseas letter Post Amendment (No. 7) Scheme 1981 (Post Office Scheme P6/1981).

Prohibitions

- 2. The following shall be added to paragraph 11 of the Scheme:
 - "(5)—(a) This sub-paragraph applies to incoming postal packets, addressed to persons at addresses within the British postal area, which were posted by or on behalf of any one person resident or carrying on business outside that area in a country other than the country in which he resides or carries on business.
 - (b) If within any period of 30 days the Post Office receives more than 100 incoming postal packets to which this sub-paragraph applies, all or any of such packets so received may, at the discretion of the Post Office, be detained and returned to the country in which they were posted or to the country in which the sender resides or carries on business.

Unpaid or underpaid postage

3. In sub-paragraph (4)(a) of paragraph 17 of the Scheme, the amount "15p" shall be deleted and "20p" inserted in its place.
