**THE TRUNK ROADS (ROUTE A98) (MACDUFF)
(PROHIBITION OF WAITING AND LOADING) ORDER 1981**

- (b) On the north side of the road from the east kerbline of Gellymill Street eastwards to a point 15 metres east of the east kerbline of Manner Street.
- (c) On the east side of the road from the north kerbline of Nicol's Brae northwards, then eastwards to the west kerbline of Gellymill Street.
- (d) On the south side of the road from the east kerbline of Gellymill Street eastwards to a point 15 metres east of the east kerbline of Market Street.
- (e) On the south side of the road from a point 15 metres west of the west kerbline of Clergy Street eastwards to a point 15 metres east of the east kerbline of Clergy Street.
- (f) On the south side of the road from the west kerbline of High Street westwards for a distance of 15 metres.
- (g) On the south side of the road from the north kerbline of Skene Street eastwards for a distance of 15 metres.

Cash on delivery parcels

The Scheme, which comes into operation on 1st July 1981, revises fees for certain ancillary services and amends certain conditions relating to particular classes of packets.

THE POST OFFICE OVERSEAS LETTER POST AMENDMENT (NO. 8)
SCHEME 1981

Made.....12th June 1981

Coming into operation.....1st July 1981

The Post office, by virtue of the powers conferred upon it by Section 28 of the Post Office Act 1969, and of all other powers enabling it in this behalf, hereby makes the following Scheme:

Commencement and citation

- 1.—(1) This Scheme shall come into operation on the 1st July 1981 and may be cited as the Post Office Overseas Letter Post Amendment (No. 8) Scheme 1981.
- (2) This Scheme shall be read as one with the Post Office Overseas Letter Post Scheme 1977 (Post Office Scheme P5/1977) (hereinafter called "the Scheme") as amended by the Post Office Overseas Letter Post Amendment (No. 1) Scheme 1979 (Post Office Scheme P2/1979), the Post Office Overseas Letter Post Amendment (No. 2) Scheme 1979 (Post Office Scheme P7/1979), the Post Office Overseas Letter Post Amendment (No. 3) Scheme 1979 (Post Office Scheme P8/1979), the Post Office Overseas Letter Post Amendment (No. 4) Scheme 1980 (Post Office Scheme P2/1980), the Post Office Overseas Letter Post Amendment (No. 5) Scheme 1980 (Post Office Scheme P7/1980), the Post Office Overseas Letter Post Amendment (No. 6) Scheme 1981 (Post Office Scheme P2/1981) and the Post Office Overseas letter Post Amendment (No. 7) Scheme 1981 (Post Office Scheme P6/1981).

Prohibitions

2. The following shall be added to paragraph 11 of the Scheme:
- "(5)—(a) This sub-paragraph applies to incoming postal packets, addressed to persons at addresses within the British postal area, which were posted by or on behalf of any one person resident or carrying on business outside that area in a country other than the country in which he resides or carries on business.
- (b) If within any period of 30 days the Post Office receives more than 100 incoming postal packets to which this sub-paragraph applies, all or any of such packets so received may, at the discretion of the Post Office, be detained and returned to the country in which they were posted or to the country in which the sender resides or carries on business.

Unpaid or underpaid postage

3. In sub-paragraph (4)(a) of paragraph 17 of the Scheme, the amount "15p" shall be deleted and "20p" inserted in its place.

Postcards

4. For sub-paragraph (1)(b) of paragraph 21 of the Scheme, there shall be substituted the following:
- "(b) A postcard shall be rectangular with its length at least equal to the width multiplied by 1.414 and be made of cardboard or of paper stout enough not to hinder its manipulation or the manipulation of other postal packets. It shall not have projecting or raised relief parts.

Printed packets

- 5.—(1) In sub-paragraph (1)(a)(V) of Paragraph 22 of the Scheme, "brochures" shall be inserted before "prospectuses".

- (2) For paragraph (a)(i) of the Proviso to paragraph 22(2) of the Scheme, there shall be substituted the following:

"(i) to indicate the name or business name, status, profession and address of the sender and of the addressee, the date of despatch, the signature, telephone exchange and number, telex number and answer-back code, telegraphic address and code, current postal account and current banking account of the sender, and serial or registration numbers."

- (3) In sub-paragraph (4) of paragraph 22 of the Scheme, the words "sub-paragraph (5)" shall be deleted and "sub-paragraphs (5) and (9)" inserted in their place.
- (4) In sub-paragraph (5) of paragraph 22 of the Scheme, the amount "£10" shall be deleted and "£20" inserted in its place.
- (5) The following sub-paragraph shall be inserted after sub-paragraph (8) of paragraph 22 of the Scheme:

"(9) Books and brochures made up in such a way as is specified in sub-paragraph (4) of this paragraph may be sealed in closed transparent wrappings."

Air mail packets

6. For sub-paragraph (i) of Paragraph 26 of the Scheme, there shall be substituted the following:

"(1) An air mail packet shall bear a blue "Air Mail" label in the top left hand corner of the address side, or alternatively the words "PAR AVION (BY AIR MAIL)" may be written boldly or typed in the same place."

Advice of delivery, enquiries and claims for compensation

7. In sub-paragraph (2) of paragraph 38 of the Scheme, the amount "25p" shall be deleted and "35p" inserted in its place.

International reply coupons

8. In sub-paragraph (2) of paragraph 39 of the Scheme, the amount "25p" shall be deleted and "30p" inserted in its place.

Postal packets in bond

9. For Schedule 7 to the Scheme, as substituted by the Post Office Overseas Letter Post Amendment (No. 6) Scheme 1981, there should be substituted the following:
