 50.—(1) This paragraph applies to calls (other than calls to which paragraph 49 or 52 applies and calls made from a call office or coin box line comprising equipment or apparatus controlled by a micro-processor) made from and to radiophones.
 (2) Where the call is obtained without the assistance of a telephone exchange operator the charge shall be at the rate specified in the appropriate item in Table A of the appropriate part of Schedule 23, one charge unit being charged for each period of time (or part of such period) in respect of any one call.
 (3) Where the call is obtained with the assistance of a telephone exchange operator, the charge shall be at the rate specified in the appropriate item in Table B of the appropriate part of Schedule 23.
