The Prince Regent, acting in the name and on the behalf of his Majesty, Sovereign of the Most Noble Order of the Garter, has been pleased, by letters patent under the sign-manual of his Royal Highness and the great seal of the Order, bearing date re-spectively the 21st day of April and the 9th day of June last, to dispense with all the statutes and regulations usually observed in regard to installation; and to grant unto his Most Christian Majesty Louis THE EIGHTEENTH, KING OF FRANCE AND NAVAR-RE, and unto his Majesty FREDERICK WILLIAM THE THIRD, KING OF PRUSSIA, Knights of the said Most Noble Order, and invested with the ensigns thereof, full power and authority to exercise all rights and privileges belonging to Knights Com-panions of the Most Noble Order of the Garter, as if their said Majesties had been formally installed; any decree, rule, or usage to the contrary notwithstanding.

The Prince Regent, acting in the name and on the behalf of his Majesty, Sovereign of the Most Noble Order of the Garter, has also been pleased, by letters patent under the sign manual of his Royal Highness and the great seal of the Order, bearing date respectively the 28th day of June last, to dispense with all the statutes and regulations usually observed in regard to installation; and grant unto the Right Honourable Robert Banks Earl of Liverpool, First Lord of his Majesty's Treasury, and unto the Right Hon. Sir Robert Stewart, commonly called Viscount Castlereagh, his Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, Knights of the said Most Noble Order, and invested with the ensigns thereof, full power and authority to exercise all rights and privileges belonging to Knights Companions of the Most Noble Order of the Garter, as if they had been formally installed; any decree, rule, or usage to the contrary notwithstanding.
