(VARIOUS STREETS — INVERURIE)  
(PROHIBITION OF WAITING) ORDER 1987

GRAMPIAN Regional Council proposes, after consultation with the Chief Constable, to make the above-named Order under Sections 1(1) and (2) and 2(1) to (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984. The effect of the Order will be to prohibit the waiting of vehicles on lengths of certain streets in Inverurie, as specified in the schedule to this Notice.

Exemptions will permit waiting:

- (1) for the purpose of picking up or setting down passengers;
- (2) for the purpose of loading or unloading goods;
- (3) where necessary in connection with any building operation or demolition; the removal of any obstruction to traffic; the maintenance of roads and the supply of gas, electricity, water and telegraphic services;
- (4) to enable a vehicle owned by a funeral undertaker or owner of funeral vehicles to be used for a purpose connected with a funeral but only on occasions when it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose on any other road; and
- (5) by disabled drivers.
