TREATY FOR SELLING SUNN HEMP.

NAVY OFFICE, February 25, 1815.

THE Principal Officers and Commissioners of his Majesty's Navy do hereby give notice, that on Wednesday the 22d of March next, at one o'clock, they will be ready to receive Tenders from such persons as may be willing to offer for the purchase of SUNN HEMP, imported from India for the use of his Majesty's Navy.

Samples of the Hemp may be seen at his Majesty's Yard at Woolwich.

Tenders will be received for the purchase of any quantity of Hemp not less than Twenty Tons.

The Hemp is lying in Warehouses at Blackwall and Woolwich, and will be delivered to the parties from either of those places as the bales arise.

The parties who may agree to purchase any of the said Hemp will be required to pay into the hands of the Treasurer of the Navy, on the day they may be agreed with, a deposit of 25l. per cent., and to take the Hemp away at their own expence from the aforesaid places within sixty days from the day they may agree for the purchase, first paying into the hands of the Treasurer of the Navy the remainder of the purchase-money, and producing at the Navy Office his receipt for the same; and in default of taking the Hemp away within the prescribed time, the deposit-money will be forfeited.

No Tender will be received after one o'clock on the day of treaty, nor any noticed unless the party, or an agent for him, attends.

If any eligible offer is made for the whole or any large proportion of the said Hemp, a reasonable extension of time will be allowed for taking away the Hemp.
