NOTICE is hereby given that The Borders Regional Council propose to make an Order under Section 68(1) of the Roads (Scotland) Act 1984 stopping-up the road described in the Schedule hereto subject to reservation of a means of passage for pedestrians and pedal cyclists specified in that Schedule.

The title of the Order is The Borders Regional Council (The Edinburgh—Newcastle Upon Tyne Trunk Road (A68)) (St Leonards Diversion) (Stopping-up) Order 1991.

A copy of the proposed Order and of the accompanying plan showing the road to be stopped-up together with a Statement of the Reasons for making the Order have been deposited at the office of The Borders Regional Council, Regional Headquarters, Newtown St. Boswells. Any person may within 28 days from 19th September 1991 object to the making of the Order by notice in writing to the Borders Regional Council, Regional Headquarters, Newtown St. Boswells. Objections should state the name and address of the objector, the matters to which they relate and the grounds on which they are made.
