A New Great Seal for the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland having been prepared by his Majesty's Chief Engraver of Seals, in pursuance of a warrant to him for that purpose under his Majesty's royal signature; and the same having been this day presented to his Royal Highness the Prince Regent in Council, and approved by his Royal Highness, in the name and on the behalf of his Majesty; and the Old Great Seal being delivered up to his Royal Highness by the Right Honourable John Lord Eldon, Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, the same was defaced in his Royal Highness's presence; and his Royal Highness was thereupon pleased to deliver to his Lordship the said New Seal, and to direct, in the name and on the behalf of his Majesty, that the same shall be made use of for sealing all things whatever which pass the Great Seal.
