CARLTON-HOUSE—SEPTEMBER 25, 1815.

This day General Funk, sent on a special mission from his Majesty the King of Saxony, had a private audience of his Royal Highness the Prince Regent, to deliver his letter of credence; to which he was introduced by Earl Bathurst, his Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, in the absence of Lord Viscount Castlereagh, and conducted by Robert Chester, Esq. Assistant-Master of the Ceremonies.
