CARLTON-HOUSE—SEPTEMBER 28, 1815.

This day his Excellency the Count de Funchal, Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary from the Prince Regent of Portugal, had his audience of leave of his Royal Highness the Prince Regent; to which he was introduced by Earl Bathurst, his Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, in the absence of Lord Viscount Castlereagh, and conducted by Robert Chester, Esq. Assistant-Master of the Ceremonies.

WHITEHALL—SEPTEMBER 30, 1815.

His Royal Highness the Prince Regent has been pleased, in the name and on the behalf of his Majesty, to grant the dignities of Earl and Marquess of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, to the Right Honourable George James Earl of Cholmondeley, and the heirs male of his body lawfully begotten, by the names, styles, and titles of Earl of Rocksavage, in the county palatine of Chester, and Marquess of Cholmondeley.

His Royal Highness the Prince Regent has also been pleased, in the name and on the behalf of his Majesty, to grant the dignities of Viscount and Earl of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, to the Right Honourable James Walter Viscount Grimston, of that part of the United Kingdom called Ireland, and Baron Verulam of Gorbambury, in the county of Hertford, and the heirs male of his body lawfully begotten, by the names, styles, and titles of Viscount Grimston and Earl Verulam.
