This day his Highness the Prince Esterhazy, Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary from his Majesty the Emperor of Austria, had his first audience of his Royal Highness the Prince Regent; to which he was introduced by Earl Bathurst, one of his Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, in the absence of Lord Viscount Castlereagh, and conducted by Robert Chester, Esq. Assistant-Master of the ceremonies.

QUEEN'S-PALACE—OCTOBER 26, 1815.

This day his Highness the Prince Esterhazy, Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary from his Majesty the Emperor of Austria, had his first audience of her Majesty; to which he was introduced by Edward Disbrowe, Esq. her Majesty's Vice-Chamberlain, and conducted by Robert Chester, Esq.
