## WESTMINSTER—APRIL 11, 1816.

This day, the Lords being met, a message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by the Deputy Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that *The Lords, authorized by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by the Prince Regent, in the name and on the behalf of his Majesty, for declaring his Majesty's Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers, to hear the Commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to*

An act for better enabling his Majesty to make provision for the establishment of her Royal Highness the Princess Charlotte Augusta and his Serene Highness Leopold George Frederick Duke of Saxe, Margrave Meissen, Landgrave of Thuringen, Prince of Cobourg of Saalfeld.

An act for empowering the Governor and Company of the Bank of England to advance the sum of six millions towards the supply for the service of the year 1816.

An act to continue, until the 5th day of July 1821, certain additional duties of Excise in Great Britain.

An act to suspend, until the 5th day of April 1820, the duty on lead exported from Great Britain.

An act to revive and continue, until two years after the expiration of the restrictions upon payments in cash by the Bank of England, an act for suspending the operation of an act of the 17th year of his present Majesty, for restraining the negotiation of promissory notes and bills of exchange under a limited sum in England.

An act to make further provision for the execution of the several acts relating to the revenues, matters, and things under the management of the Commissioners of Customs and Port-Duties, and of the Commissioners of Inland Excise and Taxes in Ireland.

An act to continue, until the 5th day of July 1816, an act of the 47th year of his present Majesty, for granting an additional bounty on double refined sugar exported.

An act to carry into effect a Convention of Commerce concluded between his Majesty and the United States of America.

An act for better regulating the offices of Receivers of Crown Rents.

An act for the more effectually detaining in custody Napoleon Buonaparte.

An act for regulating the intercourse with the Island of Saint Helena during the time Napoleon Buonaparte shall be

detained there, and for indemnifying persons in the cases therein mentioned.

And several English road, &c. acts, and eight private acts.
