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3. The monthly prize fund is shared between these bands as follows (subject to any adjustments required by paragraphs 4 to 7):

Higher value prizes	10%
Medium value prizes	15%
Lower value prizes	75%

4. Higher value band – The share allocated to this band is used to fund one £1,000,000 prize, and the balance is divided amongst the remaining prize values in equal shares. The number of prizes of each value is calculated by dividing the amount of the share by the prize value. Any balance which is less than half the prize value is then carried forward to the calculation for the next lower prize value. If any balance of a share is at least half of the prize value, an additional prize of that value is awarded and the shortfall is taken from the allocation for the next prize value share. The £5,000 prizes are also calculated in this way with any surplus or shortfall being similarly carried to or from the share allocated to the medium value band. (But see paragraph 8.)
5. Medium value band – Prizes are calculated in the ratio of one £1,000 prize for every three £500 prizes. Any surplus is added to the share allocated to the lower value band. (But see paragraph 7.)
6. Lower value band – The distribution of £100 and £50 prizes is made on the basis of awarding the maximum number of £100 prizes consistent with the overall total number of prizes being in the proportion of one prize for every 19,000 eligible Bond units. Any surplus is carried forward to the following month's draw.
7. In the event that the allocation of the monthly prize fund between the higher, medium and lower value prizes does not meet the cost of awarding the prizes in the proportion of one prize for every 19,000 eligible Bond units the Director may increase the allocation to the lower value band at the expense of the higher and medium value bands to the extent necessary to produce that proportion.

PROPOSED MODIFICATIONS OF THE LICENCE OF
BRITISH TELECOMMUNICATIONS (BT)

- 1 THE Director General of Telecommunications ("the Director"), in accordance with section 12(2) of the Telecommunications Act 1984 (the "Act"), hereby gives notice that he proposes to make modifications to the licence granted to British Telecommunications ("BT") on 22nd June 1984.
- 2 The Director proposes to make the modifications, described in the schedule ("the Schedule") to modify BT's obligations in relation to its international operations so that they are appropriate in the context of liberalisation of the markets for international telecommunications services.
- 3 The Director is required by section 12(2) of the Act to consider any representations or objections which are duly made and not withdrawn. Following consultation and BT's agreement with them, the Director proposes to make the modifications forthwith.
- 4 The consultation procedure comprises two stages. In the first stage, representations on or objections to the proposed
