### MEMORANDUM.

His Royal Highness the Prince Regent has been pleased, in the name and on the behalf of his Majesty, to approve of permission being granted to the 49th regiment of infantry to bear on its colours and appointments, in addition to any other badges or devices which may have been heretofore granted to the regiment, the word "Talavera," in consideration of the distinguished gallantry displayed by that regiment in the battle of Talavera, on the 27th and 28th July 1809.

1st Regiment of Dragoon Guards—Lieutenant George Quicke, from half-pay of the Regiment, to be Lieutenant, vice Brooke, who exchanges.
