WESTMINSTER—MAY 23, 1817.

This day, the Lords being met, a message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by the Deputy Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that *The Lords, authorized by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by the Prince Regent, in the name and on the behalf of his Majesty, for declaring his Majesty's Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers, to hear the Commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to*

An act for granting to his Majesty a sum of money to be raised by lotteries.

An act to explain and amend an act made in the 48th year of his present Majesty, for repealing the duties of assessed taxes, and granting new duties in lieu thereof, and to exempt such dwelling-houses as may be employed for the sole purpose of trade, or of lodging goods, wares, or merchandize, from the duties charged by the said act.

An act to amend and render more effectual four several acts passed in the 48th, 49th, 52d, and 56th years of his present Majesty, for enabling the Commissioners for the reduction of the national debt to grant life-annuities.

An act for repealing the duties of customs on buck wheat imported into this kingdom, and for granting other duties, until the 25th day of March 1821, in lieu thereof.

An act to regulate the interests and periods of payment of navy, victualling, and transport bills.

An act to alter and enlarge the powers of an act passed in the 54th year of his present Majesty, intituled, "An act for the further improvement of the land revenue of the crown."

An act to extend the powers of two acts for allowing British plantation sugar and coffee, and other articles imported into Bermuda in British ships, to be exported to America in foreign vessels, and to permit articles, the produce of America, to be imported into the said island in foreign ships, to certain other articles.

An act to extend to Newfoundland the provisions of an act passed in the 52d year of his present Majesty's reign, for permitting the exportation of wares, goods, and merchandize, from any of his Majesty's islands in the West Indies, to any other of the said islands, and to and from any of the British colonies on the Continent of America, and the said islands and colonies.

An act for improving and maintaining the harbour of Ayr, and for regulating vessels resorting thereto.

And several English acts, and twelve private acts.
