The City of Edinburgh Council gives notice that it has submitted an application to the Scottish Ministers for 'Approval in Principle' of a proposed Integrated Transport Initiative. The Initiative would comprise a package of major transport investment measures linked with a congestion charging scheme, under Section 49 of the Transport (Scotland) Act 2001.

If granted, the Approval in Principle would permit the City of Edinburgh Council to undertake detailed development work on the Initiative over the next two to three years, including extensive public consultation on the form the proposals could take. It would not permit the Council to introduce the measures, a further application to Scottish Ministers for Detailed Approval is required if the Council decides to proceed after completing all the preparatory work.

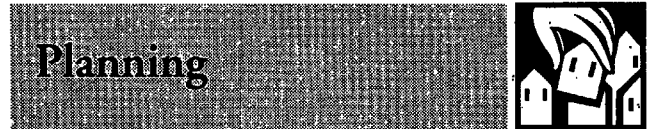
A copy of the Order together with explanatory map, a copy of the press notice, a statement of the Council's reasons for making this
