WAR-OFFICE—August 20, 1818.

His Royal Highness the Prince Regent has been pleased, in the name and on the behalf of his Majesty, to approve of the 91st regiment being permitted to bear on its colours and appointments, in addition to any other badges or devices which may have heretofore been granted to the regiment, the following words, viz. "Pyrennees," "Nivelle," "Nive," and "Orthes," in commemoration of the distinguished services of the regiment in the Pyrennees, in July 1813; at Nivelle, in November 1813; in the operations connected with the passage of the Nive, on the 9th, 10th, and 11th December 1813; and at Orthes, in the month of February 1814.

His Royal Highness the Prince Regent has been pleased, in the name and on the behalf of his Majesty, to approve of the following regiments being permitted to bear on their colours and appointments, in addition to any other badges or devices which may have heretofore been granted to them, the distinctions under mentioned, viz. 29th regiment of foot, the words "Vimiera," "Talavera," and "Albuhera," in commemoration of the distinguished services of that regiment at the battle of Vimiera, on 21st August 1808; at Talavera, on 27th and 28th July 1809; and at Albuhera, on 16th May 1811. 53d regiment, the word "Talavera," in commemoration of the services of the late 2d battalion at the battle of Talavera, on 27th and 28th July 1809.

HOSPITAL-STAFF—Staff-Surgeon Simon Rawling, from the half-pay, to be Surgeon to the forces vice William Wallace, who retires; dated August 25, 1818.
