UPSET FEU-DUTIES REDUCED.

ADJOURNED ROUP OF BUILDING GROUND AT INVERLEITH.

There will be feued, by Public Auction, upon Wednesday the 21st day of April 1819, within the Royal Exchange Coffeehouse, Edinburgh, at one o'clock afternoon, in virtue of an Act of Parliament, at the reduced rate of 30l. per English acre of yearly feu-duty.

ELEVEN LOTS OF LAND fronting the Queensferry road, immediately to the west of Stockbridge, being part of the lands and estate of Inverleith. Each lot measures about 1 rood 5 poles 8 yards of ground English measure, and one dwelling-house only is to be built upon each lot.
