MEMORANDUM.

His Royal Highness the Prince Regent has been pleased, in the name and on the behalf of his Majesty, to approve of the following regiments being permitted to bear on their colours and appointments, the distinctions under mentioned, viz. 4th light dragoons—the words, “*Talavera*,” “*Albuera*,” “*Vittoria*,” and “*Toulouse*,” in commemoration of the distinguished services of the regiment at the battle of Talavera, on 27th and 28th July 1809; at Albuera, on 16th May 1811; at Vittoria, on 21st June 1813; and in the attack of the position covering Toulouse, on 10th April 1814. 50th regiment of foot—the words “*Vittoria*,” “*Pyrennees*,” “*Nive*,” and “*Orthes*,” in commemoration of the distinguished services of the regiment at the battle of Vittoria, on 21st June 1813; in the Pyrennees, in the month of July 1813; in the operations connected with the passage of the Nive, on the 9th, 10th, and 11th December 1813; and at Orthes, on 27th February 1814.
