MEMORANDUM.

His Royal Highness the Prince Regent has been pleased, in the name and on the behalf of his Majesty, to approve of the 28th regiment of foot being permitted to bear on its colours and appointments, in addition to any other badges or devices which may heretofore have been granted to the regiment, the words "Pyrennees," "Nivelle," "Nive," and "Orthes," in commemoration of the distinguished services of the regiment in the Pyrennees, in the month of July 1813; at Nivelle, on 10th November 1813; in the operations connected with the passage of the Nive, on the 9th, 10th, and 11th December 1813; and at Orthes, on 27th February 1814.
