CARLTON-HOUSE—SEPTEMBER 17, 1819.

This day the Baron de Strienceld, Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary from the King of Sweden, had a private audience of the Prince Regent, to deliver a letter from his Sovereign; to which he was introduced by Lord Viscount Castlereagh, his Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, and conducted by Sir Robert Chester, Knt. Master of the Ceremonies.
