DUBLIN-CASTLE—OCTOBER 18, 1819.

His Royal Highness the Prince Regent has been pleased, in the name and on the behalf of his Majesty, to grant to Sir John Francis Cradock, G. C. B. a General in his Majesty's Forces, and to the heirs-male of his body lawfully begotten, the dignity of a Baron of this part of his Majesty's United Kingdom called Ireland, by the name, style, and title of Baron Howden, of Grimston, and of Spaldington and of Cradockstown, in the county of Kildare.

His Royal Highness the Prince Regent has been graciously pleased, in the name and on the behalf of his Majesty, to appoint Lieutenant-General the Earl of Dalhousie, G. C. B. to be Captain-General and Governor in Chief of the provinces of Lower and Upper Canada, Nova Scotia, New Brunswick, and the islands of Prince Edward and Cape Breton.

His Royal Highness has also been pleased, in the name and on the behalf of his Majesty, to appoint Major-General Sir James Kempt, G. C. B. to be Lieutenant-Governor of Nova Scotia and its dependencies.
