CARLTON-HOUSE—OCTOBER 29, 1819.

This day the Count de Byland, Chamberlain of his Majesty the King of the Netherlands, had a private audience of the Prince Regent, to deliver a letter, notifying to his Royal Highness the death of her late Royal Highness the Duchess-Dowager of Brunswick; to which he was introduced by Lord Viscount Castlereagh, his Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, and conducted by Sir Robert Chester, Knt. Master of the Ceremonies.

MEMORANDUM.

His Royal Highness the Prince Regent has been pleased, in the name and on the behalf of his Majesty, to approve of the 63d regiment of foot being permitted to bear on its colours and appointments, in addition to any other badges or devices which may have heretofore been granted to the regiment, the words, "Martinique," and "Guadaloupe," in commemoration of the distinguished gallantry displayed by the regiment in the descent upon the island of Martinique, in the month of February 1809, and in the attack upon the island of Guadaloupe, in the month of February 1810.

6th Regiment of Dragoons—Cornet William Hamilton Williamson, from the 22d light dragoons, to be Cornet, vice Hugh Davis Griffith, who retires upon half-pay 22d light dragoons.

8th Regiment of Foot—Serjeant-Major William Only, late of the 3d battalion rifle brigade, to be Quartermaster, vice Keirnan, removed from the service. Commissions both dated October 21.

GARRISONS—Major-General Sir George Cooke, K. C. B. to be Lieutenant-Governor of Portsmouth, vice Major-General Sir James Kempt; dated October 20.

HOSPITAL STAFF—Assistant-Surgeon William Henry Hume, M. D. from half-pay, to be Assistant-Surgeon to the forces, vice John Woodroffe, M. D. who exchanges; dated October 21, 1819.

MEMORANDA.

The promotion of Major Ponsonby Watts, on half-pay as an unattached officer, to be Lieutenant-Colonel by Brevet, has been antedated to 1st January 1812.

Second Lieutenant John Bligh, of the rifle brigade, has been superseded, being absent without leave; dated October 21, 1819.

The appointment of Assistant-Surgeon Brown, from half-

pay 4th dragoon guards, to be Assistant-Surgeon to the forces, on 23d ultimo, has not taken place.
