WHITEHALL—DECEMBER 31, 1819.

His Royal Highness the Prince Regent has been pleased, in the name and on the behalf of his Majesty, to appoint Robert Graham, Esq. M. D. to be Regius Professor of Botany in the University of Edinburgh, vacant by the death of Dr Daniel Rutherford.

WESTMINSTER—DECEMBER 30, 1819.

THIS day, the Lords being met, a message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that *The Lords, authorized by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by the Prince Regent, in the name and on the behalf of his Majesty, for declaring his Majesty's Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to*

An act to subject certain publications to the duties of stamps upon newspapers, and to make other regulations for restraining the abuses arising from the publication of blasphemous and seditious libels.

An act for the more effectual prevention and punishment of blasphemous and seditious libels.

And an English act, and two private acts.
