WHITEHALL—JANUARY 24, 1820.

Yesterday morning, at ten o'clock, departed this life, at Sidmouth, after a short illness, his Royal Highness Edward Duke of Kent and Strathern, his Majesty's fourth son, to the great grief of all the Royal Family.

WHITEHALL—JANUARY 20, 1820.

His Royal Highness the Prince Regent has been pleased, in the name and on the behalf of his Majesty, to constitute and appoint the Right Honourable Robert Viscount Melville; Sir William Johnstone Hope, Knight Commander of the Most Honourable Military Order of the Bath, Vice-Admiral of the Blue Squadron of his Majesty's Fleet; Sir George Warrender, Bart.; Sir John Osborn, Bart.; Sir George Cockburn, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Honourable Military Order of the Bath, Vice-Admiral of the Blue Squadron of his Majesty's Fleet; the Honourable Sir Henry Hotham, Knight Commander of the Most Honourable Military Order of the Bath, Rear-Admiral of the Red Squadron of his Majesty's Fleet, and Sir George Clerk, Bart. to be his Majesty's Commissioners for executing the office of High Admiral of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and the Dominions, Islands, and Territories thereunto belonging.

DOWNING-STREET—JANUARY 22, 1820.

His Royal Highness the Prince Regent has been graciously pleased, in the name and on the behalf of his Majesty, to appoint Major-General Sir Benjamin D'Urban, K. C. B. to be Governor of the Island of Antigua, in the room of Major-General Ramsay, deceased.
