NOTICE OF THE ISSUE OF A SUBMARINE PIPELINE WORKS
AUTHORISATION**

The Oil and Gas Authority gives notice that it has decided to issue, and in consequence has issued, a works authorisation to be held by ARCO British Limited, LLC whose address is Chertsey Road, Sunbury on Thames, Middlesex, TW16 7BP for the construction of a pipeline system between the Arundel Well, the Arundel Midline Tie-in Structure and the IUTA.

Except with the consent of the Oil and Gas Authority, the 273.1 Millimetre Production pipeline shall only be used to convey Produced Fluids; the 60.3 Millimetre Gas Lift pipeline shall only be used to convey Gas Lift; the 60.3 Millimetre Methanol pipeline shall only be used to convey Methanol; the Controls Jumper Bundle shall only be used to convey Hydraulic and Scale Inhibitor; the Controls Jumper Bundle shall only be used to convey Hydraulic and Methanol; the Electrical Flying Lead shall only be used to convey Signal and the 4 x Electrical Flying Leads shall only be used to convey Power/Signal.

The pipelines may be used by the Holder and with the Holder's agreement, and with the consent of the Oil and Gas Authority, by other persons.

ARCO British Limited, LLC have been appointed operator of the pipelines.

Notice is hereby given that NLEI Ltd, (company number SC511747 at registered address Clyde View (Suite F3), Riverside Business Park, 22 Pottery Street, Greenock, PA15 2UZ) has applied to the Scottish Ministers for consent under Section 36 of the Electricity Act 1989 to construct and operate a wind farm known as North Lowther Energy Initiative (NLEI) within the Queensberry Estate, approximately 5km south of Crawfordjohn, 2km northeast of Sanquhar and west of Wanlockhead in Dumfries and Galloway (Central Grid Reference 283464, 615138). The installed capacity of the proposed generating station would be up to 147 MW comprising up to 35 turbines with a maximum ground to blade tip height of 149 metres. The proposed development is subject to Environmental Impact Assessment and the developer has produced an Environmental Statement.

NLEI Ltd has also applied for a direction under Section 57(2) of the Town and Country Planning (Scotland) Act 1997 that planning permission for the development be deemed to be granted.

Any subsequent additional information which is submitted by the developer will be subject to further public notice in this manner, and representations to such information will be accepted as per this notice.

As a result of a statutory objection from the relevant planning authority, or where Scottish Ministers decide to exercise their discretion to do so, Scottish Ministers can also cause a Public Local Inquiry (PLI) to be held.

Following examination of the environmental information, Scottish Ministers will determine the application for consent in two ways:

- Consent the proposal, with or without conditions attached; or
- Reject the proposal
