This day, had audience of his Majesty, his Excellency the Baron Fagel, Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary from the King of the Netherlands, to deliver new credentials, and letters from his sovereign in reply to communications from this court upon the death of his late Majesty and his Royal Highness the Duke of Kent; his Highness the Prince Esterhazy, Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary from the Emperor of Austria, to deliver his new credentials; his Serene Highness Prince Philip of Hesse Hombourg, on a mission extraordinary from the Emperor of Austria, to deliver a letter to the King upon his accession to the throne; Monsieur de Pfeffel, Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary from the King of Bavaria, to deliver new credentials, and letters from his sovereign in reply to communications from this court upon the death of his late Majesty and his Royal Highness the Duke of Kent; Baron de Stierneld, Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary from the King of Sweden, to deliver his new credentials; General the Baron de Bjornstjerna, on a special mission from the King of Sweden, to deliver a letter to his Majesty on his accession to the throne; and Baron Langsdorff, Minister Resident from their Royal Highnesses the Grand Dukes of Baden and Hesse, to deliver new credentials, and letters in reply to communications from this court upon the death of his late Majesty and his Royal Highness the Duke of Kent; to which several audiences they were respectively introduced by Earl Bathurst, in the absence of Lord Viscount Castlereagh, his Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, and conducted by Sir Robert Chester, Master of the Ceremonies.
