MEMORANDUM.

His Majesty has been pleased to approve of the 20th regiment of foot being permitted to bear on its colours and appointments, in addition to any other badges or devices which may have heretofore been granted to the regiment, the words "Egmont-op-Zee," in commemoration of the distinguished services of the regiment at Egmont-op-Zee, on 2d October 1799.

APRIL 14, 1820.

2d Regiment of Dragoon Guards—Lieutenant A. James Caldwell, from 80th foot, to be Lieutenant, vice Peers, who exchanges.

1st Regiment of Dragoons—Captain William Cox, from the rifle brigade, to be Captain, vice Webb, who exchanges. Commissions dated March 30.

7th Regiment of Light Dragoons—To be Captains, by purchase—Lieutenants Robert Douglas, vice Mayne, who retires; dated March 29. John Wildman, vice Heyliger, who retires; dated March 30.

To be Lieutenants, by purchase—Cornets Charles Hill, vice Douglas; dated March 29. Arthur Chichester, vice Wildman.

To be Cornet, by purchase—Broadhead, gent. vice Chichester.

11th—Cornet Lord Thomas Cecil, from 10th light dragoons; to be Lieutenant, by purchase, vice Arbutnot, promoted in the 28th foot.

15th—Lieutenant George Lowson, from half-pay 2d line battalion King's German legion, to be Cornet, without purchase, vice Buckley, promoted. All dated March 30.

43d Regiment of Foot—To be Captains—Brevet Major Henry George Macleod, from half-pay 35th foot, vice Simon, appointed to 6th royal veteran battalion; dated March 29. Captain John Napper Jackson, from half-pay 94th foot, vice John Pitts, who exchanges, receiving the difference.

61st—Lieutenant Philip Smith, from half-pay 58th foot, to be Lieutenant, vice James Atkin, who exchanges.

Rifle Brigade—Captain Samuel Webb, from the 1st dragoons, to be Captain, vice William Cox, who exchanges.

2d West India Regiment—Captain Stepney Rawson Stepney, from half-pay 4th West India regiment, to be Captain, vice Thomas FitzGerald, who exchanges. Ensign James Dawson to be Lieutenant, without purchase, vice Hield, deceased. Henry Dely, gent. to be Ensign, vice Dawson. All dated March 30, 1820.

1st Royal Veteran Battalion—Lieutenant William Gibson, from the 5th royal veteran battalion, to be Lieutenant, vice Granger, deceased; dated February 24. Serjeant-Major Robert Young, from the 1st or grenadier regiment of foot guards, to be Adjutant, with the rank of Ensign.

James Mitchell, from 88th foot, vice Hobson, whose appointment has not taken place. Francis Macfarlane, from half-pay 3d West India regiment. All dated February 24, 1820.
