His Majesty has been pleased to nominate and appoint Mr John Welsh to the office of Commissary of the Commissariat of Peebles, void by the death of Mr John Murray Robertson.

72d Regiment of Foot—Hospital-Assistant Robert Knox, M. D. to be Assistant-Surgeon, vice Hamilton, promoted in the 54th foot.

MEMORANDA.

The appointment of Staff-Surgeon James Taylor, from half-pay, to be Surgeon to the forces, as stated in the Gazette of 11th December last, has not taken place.

Lieutenant William Cradock, of the 43d foot, has been permitted to retire from the service.
