## CARLTON-HOUSE—JUNE 14, 1820.

This day his Excellency the Count de Lieven, Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary from the Emperor of all the Russias, had a private audience of his Majesty, to deliver his new credentials; also his Excellency the Duke de Frias, Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary from the King of the Spains, had his first private audience of his Majesty, to deliver his credentials; likewise the Count de Palmella, Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary from the King of Portugal and the Brazils, had a private audience of his Majesty, to deliver his letter of recall; and Richard Rush, Esq. Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary from the United States of America, had a private audience of his Majesty, to deliver his new credentials; to which several audiences they were respectively introduced by Lord Viscount Castlereagh; his Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, and conducted by Sir Robert Chester, Knt. Master of the Ceremonies.
