

WESTMINSTER-JUNE 22, 1820.

TRIS day, the Lords being met, a message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod -----quainting them, that The Louds, unnorized by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by his Majesty, for declaring his Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to An act for raising the sum of five millions by way of annui-

ties. An act for applying certain moneys therein mentioned for the service of the year one thousand eight hundred and twenty.

act, for funding Exchequer-Bills to a certain amount. An and for raising a sum of money, by way of annuities, for the service of the year one thousand eight hundred and twenty.

An act for punishing mutiny and desertion, and for the better payment of the army and their quarters. An act to repeal the drawback on certain gold articles exorred, and to permit the exportation of cordage entitled to ounty free, from right of pre-emption by the Commisioners of the Navy.

An act to repeal so much of several acrs as requires bonds to be given to his Majesty in certain cases, and the taking of certain oaths in matters relating to the revenue of customs,

certain oaths in matters relating to the revenue of customs, and to prevent fees being offered or given to officers and o-ther persons in the service of the customs. An act to continue, until the twenty-fifth day of July one thousand eight hundred and twenty-one, an act of the fifty-minth year of his lare Majesty, to continue certain laws of exci-e with regard to crown glass and fint and phial glass, and to alter certain laws with regard to fint glass.
