## CARLTON-HOUSE—JUNE 28, 1820.

This day his Excellency the Baron Fagel, Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary from the King of the Netherlands, had a private audience of his Majesty, to deliver letters from his sovereign, announcing the death of her late Royal Highness the Princess Dowager of Orange, and also the birth of a Prince to their Royal Highnesses the Prince and Princess of Orange; his Excellency was introduced to the audience by Lord Viscount Castlereagh, his Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, and conducted by Sir Robert Chester, Knt. Master of the Ceremonies.

## WESTMINSTER—JUNE 30, 1820.

THIS day, the Lords being met, a message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that *The Lords, authorized by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by his Majesty, for declaring his Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read;* and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to

An act for raising a loan of twelve millions from the Commissioners for the reduction of the national debt.

An act to provide for the charge of the addition to the public funded debt of Great Britain, for the service of the year 1820.

An act to amend and continue, until the 20th day of June 1824, an act of the 52d year of his late Majesty, for the more effectual preservation of the peace, by enforcing the duties of watching and warding.

An act to repeal part of an act, made in the 9th year of the reign of his late Majesty King George the Second, relative to the manufacture of sail-cloth.

An act for maintaining and repairing the military roads in the county of Perth, and the several branches or roads of communication therewith connected.
