CARLTON-HOUSE—JULY 19, 1820.

This day a deputation from the United States of the Ionian Islands, consisting of the Most Excellent Senator Zavo, and the Most Noble Chevalier Petrizzopulo, attended by the Earl of Guildford, Knight Grand Cross of the most distinguished Order of St Michael and St George; Colonel Sir Frederick Hankey, Knight Commander of the said Order, Secretary; and Captain Edwards, Aid-de-Camp to Sir T. Maitland, G. C. B., Grand Master of the Order; and his Majesty's Lord High Commissioner in the Ionian Islands, was introduced to his Majesty upon the throne, by the Lord Chamberlain of his Majesty's Household and his Majesty's Master of the Ceremonies, to deliver an address from the United States of the Ionian Islands, on his Majesty's accession to the throne; after which, his Majesty was most graciously pleased to invest the Senator Zavo with the ensigns of a Knight Commander of the Order of St Michael and St George, which were presented by Sir George Nayler, King of Arms of the Order, on a crimson velvet cushion.

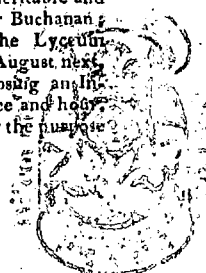
