## LORD CHAMBERLAIN'S OFFICE—August 15, 1820.

Yesterday, about four o'clock in the afternoon, the remains of her late Royal Highness the Duchess of York were privately interred at Weybridge Church, in the county of Surrey, in a vault which had previously been prepared under her Royal Highness's special directions.
